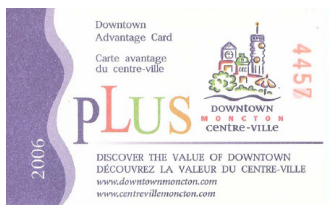

Music on Saturday afternoons at Joe Moka: Hélène Godin will get the ball rolling

Café Joe Moka, located downtown Moncton on the corner of Robinson Square and Main Street, will now offer live music on Saturday afternoons. Moncton artist Hélène Godin (hailing from Petit-Rocher) will be the first singer to perform, on Saturday January 13, at 1:00 p.m.

Owner, Yvan Laviolette, is happy to be able to offer this new entertainment to his clientele. "The Café is already an art gallery, and now with live music, the place will really become a true cultural venue for downtown Moncton." Laviolette explains that the demand for music at the Café came from his clients. "We did a survey and many clients suggested that we invite local artists and musicians, so we decided to give it a try. We will start with music on Saturday afternoons and if it works well, we could offer the same kind of shows at other periods of the week. And we could also have poetry readings and storytelling", he adds.

The Moncton Public Library invites the public to view a special exhibit on display on the second floor of the library.

"Single Mothers and Photovoice" is a community health project, which was led by Dr. Lynne Duffy from the UNB Faculty of Nursing in Moncton, along with partner Support to Single Parents and its director Nancy Hartling.

Single mothers with cameras in hand captured and described many aspects of their lives; the challenges, the frustrations and the joys. This research process and resulting display has helped them to find a public voice and to feel more a part of their community.

These creative poster boards will be on display until the end of January and you can see them while visiting the library at 644 Main St. during open hours: Tuesday to Thursday from 9:00 AM to 8:30 PM and Friday and Saturday from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
