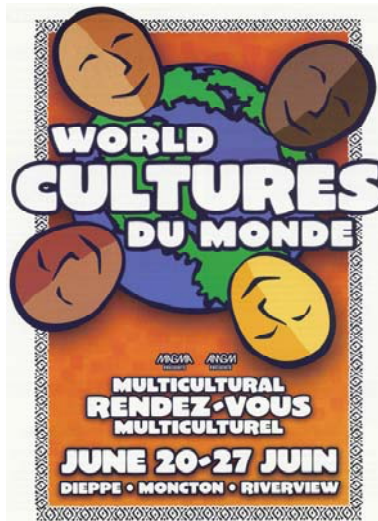

WORLD CULTURES DU MONDE

Starting Monday, Greater Moncton will be a true multicultural haven! The **World Cultures du monde** festival runs all week until June 27th at various venues throughout Moncton, Dieppe and Riverview. The Multicultural rendez-vous includes a mural unveiling, series of films, art exhibitions, street dancing, music like you've never heard before and loads of ethnic foods. **Most events are free, family-oriented and open to the general public.** Festivities kick off at the Capitol Theatre on Monday with the unveiling of a multicultural mural created by students from Moncton Queen Elizabeth school. The mural, along with works by students from Riverview Middle and Birchmount schools will be on display all week during the festival. Downtown's Main Street will be transformed into a Mini Mardi Gras when **Cultures on Main** takes over the street in front of the **Capitol Theatre** on Saturday, June 25. From noon to 4 p.m., the street will be filled with music and dance featuring the **Chinese Cultural Association** and the **Mi'kmaq Dancers**.
