## HALLOWEEN AND CURFEW

The City of Moncton wishes to advise the public that **Halloween will be celebrated on October 31st**, even though it falls on a Monday. The City of Moncton has no official hours for trick-or treating; however, people are **encouraged to go trick-or-treating between 5 p.m. and 8 p.m.**, before it gets too dark or too late. There is a year-round curfew for children under sixteen (bylawH-402). They are not allowed on the streets after 10 p.m. without proper supervision with the exception of July and August when the curfew is set at 11:00 p.m. Follow these tips for a fun and safe Halloween night • Young children should be accompanied by an adult • Go trick-or-treating as part of a group, or with your parents • Tell your parents what route you plan to take, and what time you'll be back • Wait outside houses; don't go inside unnecessarily • Never get in the vehicle of someone you don't know • Wear a short costume or clothing to avoid tripping • To see and hear properly, wear makeup instead of a mask • Bring a lit flashlight to see and to be seen • Make sure your parents check your candy before you eat them. **Stay safe and have fun!**
